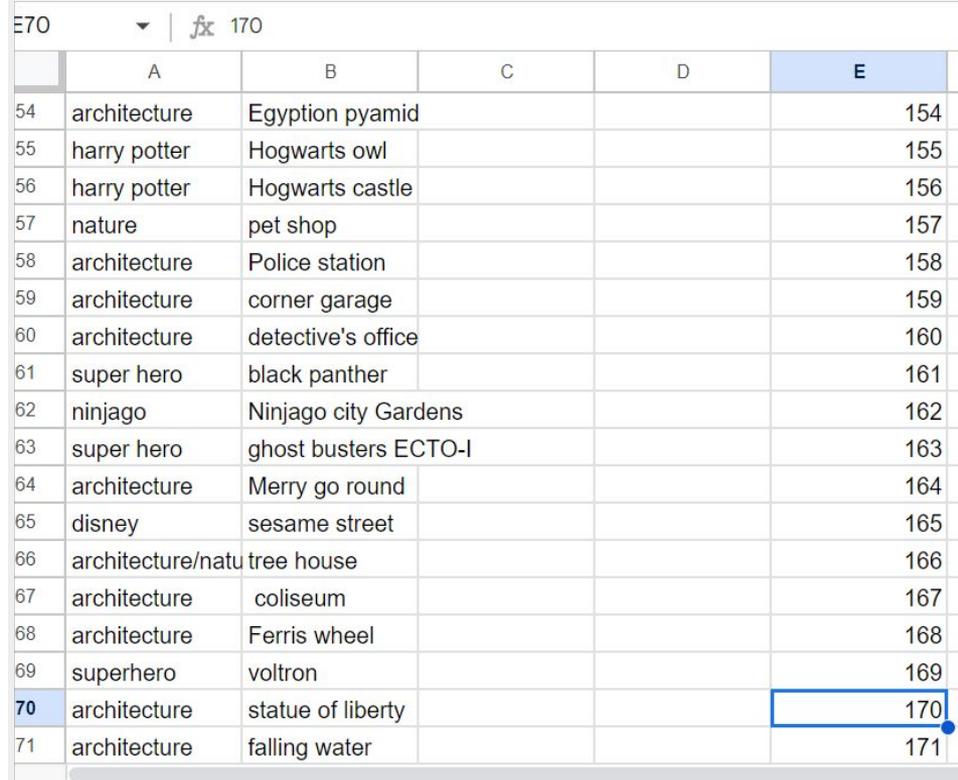


What I Did

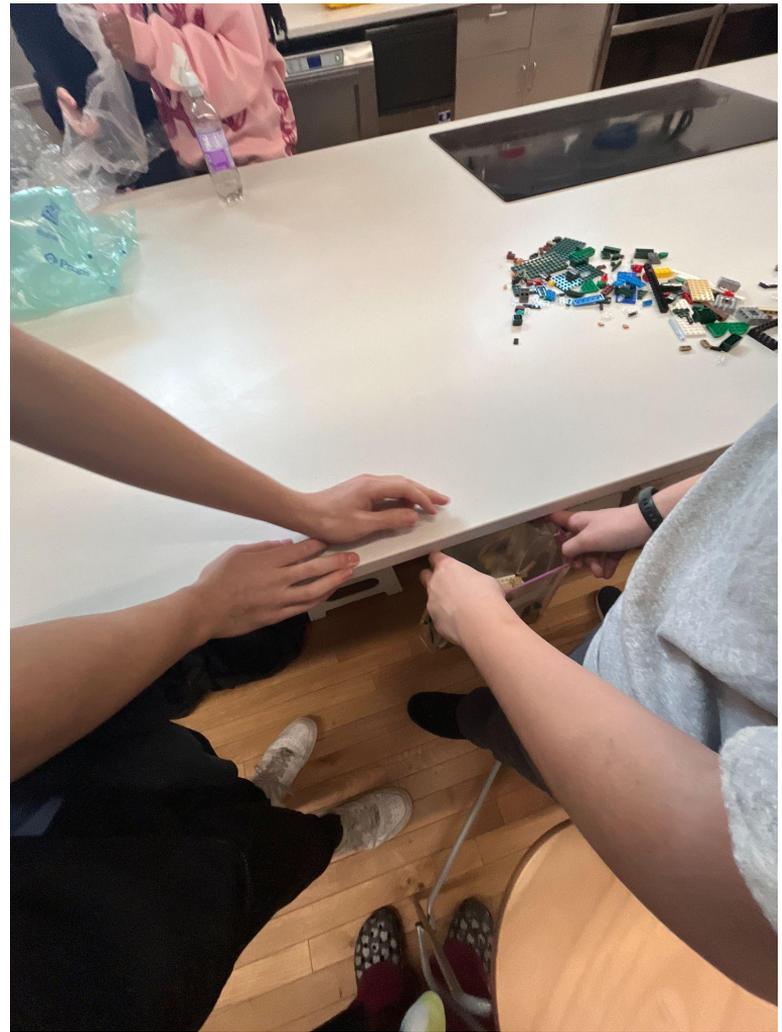
