Celebrating Adventure, Belonging, and Character

Each year, I have the privilege of hearing from campers, families, and our partner camps about the ways the summer experience shapes lives. I hear stories of first-time adventures, of finding a place to belong, and of the personal growth that happens when a young person is challenged and supported in equal measure. These stories remind me why our work matters so deeply.

This year, our annual report celebrates the ABC's of ATS: Adventure, Belonging, and Character.

Adventure is at the heart of camp. Our ATS campers spend their summers exploring the outdoors, learning new skills, and gaining confidence in their abilities as they face and overcome challenges.

Belonging grows in the cabins, on the trail, and through year-round programs like Compass and Capstone. These experiences create a community where youth feel valued for who they are and learn to value others in return.

Character is built through responsibility, teamwork, and service. Campers work together to achieve shared success, Capstone participants lead service projects in their hometowns, Outdoor Leaders develop the responsibility and skills necessary for future roles as camp counselors and outdoor industry professionals, and Fellows serve as role models and mentors for younger children while leaning into leadership at camp.


Since 1989, A Thousand Summers has awarded almost 1,900 camperships and invested over \$11.2 million in transformative summer experiences. This impact is possible because of you, our donors, partners, staff, and volunteers, who believe in the power of camp to change lives.

Campership Program

A Thousand Summers firmly believes that extended-stay wilderness summer camp programs play a critical role in youth development. Camp provides adventure, reinforces learning, creates a sense of belonging, strengthens character, and allows children to thrive.

These types of highly impactful enrichment opportunities are financially out of reach for the families we serve. We work to remove those barriers so that the significant personal growth that can be achieved at camp is more broadly accessible. Included in that commitment is dedicated mentoring to support and prepare each camper and their family to extract the greatest benefit from the camp experience.

Each summer, we send kids ranging in age from 10-17 who are from underrepresented backgrounds to one of thirteen carefully selected, high-quality camps. In 2025, we awarded 136 camperships.

We commit to offering this multi-week program over multiple summers to expose the kids we serve to progressively more challenging outdoor adventures and to maximize their sense of belonging and character development.

Camp pushes kids beyond their comfort zones in a safe and supportive environment. They learn to navigate new friendships and community living and discover their individual roles within a larger group. They work together to overcome challenges and experience the thrill of shared success. They develop confidence, independence, and resilience.

Our work is about much more than providing financial assistance for a summer of friends and fun. By breaking down barriers to the camp experience, we are making a positive and long-term impact on the lives of the young people we serve.





The Compass Program

The Compass Program offers virtual group learning experiences to our campership recipients that foster meaningful relationships and guide them to navigate their lives with a sense of belonging and purpose. It prepares the participants for the camp experience through extension activities and discussions around camp-related themes.

Younger participants are guided through activities exploring topics around belonging. They investigate what it means to understand, value, and accept themselves, how to build meaningful relationships with others, and how to proactively build belonging within the wider community.

Older participants explore who they are and what matters to them so they can intentionally maximize


their growth at camp. They discover and share their strengths and discuss how they can contribute to their community. Ultimately, they learn skills to help them live a life of purpose.

Of this year's participants who were surveyed, 89% said they would apply what they learned in the Compass sessions to both their time at camp and to other situations at home or school.

Through the Compass Program, kids from all of our different camps come together to create a community in which they learn about themselves, celebrate each other, and identify character traits that will help them succeed.

The Capstone Program

The Capstone Program invites older campership recipients, with their Mentor’s support, to design and lead a service project in their community during the school year. In 2025, seventeen Capstone Program participants successfully completed projects.

Through the work on their Capstone projects, participants demonstrate the leadership skills and character attained through their camp experiences to make a difference for others. They learn and practice organizational, communication, and management skills that can serve them and their communities now and in the future.

Capstone Program service project outcomes are shared with our camps to enhance campers’ leadership program applications. Capstone Program service hours accrued may also count towards school community service requirements.

The Capstone Program empowers the young people we serve to give back in personally meaningful ways and to create change by doing good in their communities.

The Outdoor Leadership Program

The Outdoor Leadership Program fills the gap between when a camper ages out of the Campership Program and when they can apply to work as a camp counselor. In 2025, we had nine Outdoor Leadership participants from six of our associate camps.

This backpacking and river travel expedition is led by a reputable outdoor adventure organization called Open Roads. While on the trip, participants focus on leadership, team building, environmental education, service learning, and acquiring wilderness tripping certifications.

The program creates opportunities to continue the personal growth and leadership development acquired at camp while providing skill-building and outdoor education experience that will be valuable should participants choose to apply to the Camp Fellowship Program or seek other employment in the outdoor industry.

Our campers come together, regardless of which camp they attended, to share their experiences, learn from one another, expand their perspectives, and transition into wilderness leaders.

The Fellowship Program

The Camp Fellowship Program provides ongoing leadership opportunities for the young people we serve as they move beyond their camper years and helps to remove the financial barrier to working as a camp counselor. Fellows receive additional training and take on additional responsibilities to support current ATS campers in exchange for a stipend and references from ATS.

Fellows serve as positive role models for campers and provide a sense of connection and belonging for our younger ATS campers as they get to know someone like them who has successfully navigated the camp experience.

In 2025, nine of our Campership Program alums were enrolled as Fellows at seven of our thirteen associate camps. This expanded representation signifies not only a greater reach for the program but also a larger number of current ATS campers who will have had exposure to a counselor who shares a similar background.

Fellows build character and professional skills through their counselor experiences and inspire younger campers to follow a similar path.

Financial Summary

Unaudited Financial Information 7/1/2024 – 6/30/2025

We had a strong year in financial terms with unrestricted fundraising at an all-time high. Overall, funds raised from our supporters along with healthy program revenues have put us in a position to invest healthily into our programs in 2025-2026. Organizational assets continue to grow as a result of new donor contributions and decent investment returns and now exceed \$5 million, 61% of which is restricted to fund camperships.

We are honored to partner with you in pursuit of our mission. Together, we are making an increasingly positive impact on the social and emotional development and leadership potential of the growing numbers of young people we are serving.


